### **RECIPE: JELLY CAKE SLICE**

- 250g plain biscuits
- 180g butter – melted
- 395g sweetened condensed milk
- 2½ tsp gelatine
- ¾ cup boiling water
- Juice of 2 lemons
- 1 packet strawberry or raspberry jelly
- 1 extra teaspoon of gelatine – for the jelly top

Line the base & sides of a sponge roll tin with baking paper.

Crush the biscuits until they resemble fine breadcrumbs. Add the melted butter & mix until Combined. Press firmly into the sponge roll tin then place in the fridge to chill.

Meantime add the 2½ tsp. of gelatine to the ¾cup of boiling water & stir until dissolved.

Place the condensed milk into a bowl & while whisking add the dissolved gelatine & the lemon juice, continuing to whisk until smooth & combined. Pour over the chilled biscuit base & return to the fridge until it just begins to start to set – approx. 30-45 minutes.

Make the jelly as per the packet instructions add the extra teaspoon of gelatine. Allow to cool to room temperature.

Carefully pour the jelly over the slice & place it back in the fridge to completely set, approximately 6 hours – overnight is best.

Using a hot knife cut into squares
