All exhibits in cooking, preserves, needlework, knitting, juniors and hand spun wool must be delivered to the pavilion at the Showgrounds between 10.30-11.30am on Friday 16th January 2026.

Exhibits by post must reach Levin not later than 5pm on Wednesday 14th January 2026 and will be delivered to the pavilion free of charge.

Points to count: When entries are 5 or over: First prize 6, second prize 4, third prize 2, VHC 1 point. When entries are under 5: First prize 6, second prize 4, third prize 2. In the case of ties for points prizes, most first to count. Where there is an equal the points are given in full to each exhibitor but the prize money is halved.




