All exhibits in cooking, preserves, needlework, knitting, juniors and hand spun wool must be delivered to the pavilion at the Showgrounds between 10.30-11.30am on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> January 2025.

Exhibits by post must reach Levin not later than 5pm on Wednesday 15th January 2025 and will be delivered to the pavilion free of charge.

Points to count: When entries are 5 or over: First prize 6, second prize 4, third prize 2, VHC 1 point. When entries are under 5: First prize 6, second prize 4, third prize 2. In the case of ties for points prizes, most first to count. Where there is an equal the points are given in full to each exhibitor but the prize money is halved.

## **RECIPE: JACK BLENKHORN'S BOILED FRUIT CAKE**

225g (8oz) Butter	350g (12oz) Sugar
3 Eggs	350g (12oz) Flour
1 x 500g packet Mixed Fruit	1 tsp Baking Powder
1 tsp Vanilla Essence	½ tsp Ground Cloves

Put fruit in large saucepan and barely cover with water. Simmer until water is gone. Add butter and stir until melted. Add sugar, stir until dissolved. Cool slightly. Add eggs and hand beat until mixture is frothy. Add other ingredients and mix until is smooth. Pour into prepared 20cm (8") square tin. Bake at 180°C (350°F) for 50-60 minutes.

Definition Hints for Relish, Chutney & Pickle:

### Pickles

- Ripe fruit or vegetables preserved in vinegar, brine or thickened mustard sauce.
- No sediment, vegetables should be identified, cut evenly, raw or lightly cooked.

### Relish

- Has finely chopped vegetables, cooked for less time than chutney so the ingredients retain their shape.
- Flowing but not runny.

### Chutney

- Has a mixture of chopped or minced fruit and vegetables cooked with vinegar, sugar and spices.
- Thicker than relish

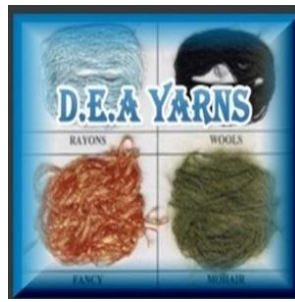
